Bible Story from 2 Kings 5:1-15



Abram Roving: Abram Roving here with good news. I am talking to a slave girl today. She is a servant in the house of Naaman. He is an important soldier here in Syria. She is with Naaman's wife right now. Young lady, I understand that you learned Naaman was sick. What was wrong?

Servant Girl: He had leprosy. There were ugly sores all over his skin.

A. Roving: What did you say to his wife?

Servant Girl: I said Naaman should go to my country, Israel, and see Elisha, who is a

I knew that Elisha was a man of God and that he could help Naaman.

A. Roving: Excuse me, Mrs. Naaman. When your servant girl told you this, did you and Naaman believe God could help?

Naaman's Wife: We did not know much about God, but we knew that our slave girl tells the truth. She is a fine girl. We were ready to try anything. Naaman went to see our king and ask him to let Naaman go to Israel.

A. Roving: I see. And the king agreed?

Naaman's Wife: Yes. In fact, he gave Naaman a letter to take to the king of Israel. The letter asked the king to help make Naaman well. The king of Israel knew he couldn't make anyone well, so he became very upset. He thought our king was trying to start a war.

A. Roving: That's very interesting. Now let's go to the land of Israel. The king

sent Naaman to Elisha. Elisha, when you heard about Naaman and his problem, what did you do?

Elisha: I wanted Naaman to know it was God—not me—who would make him well. I didn't even see the man. I just sent a message out to Naaman. I said that he should wash seven times in the

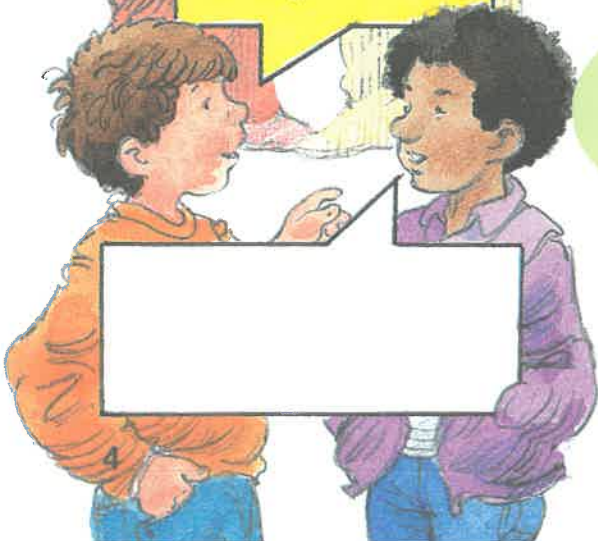
Nobody loves me!

I'm afraid to go home because I got in trouble today at school.



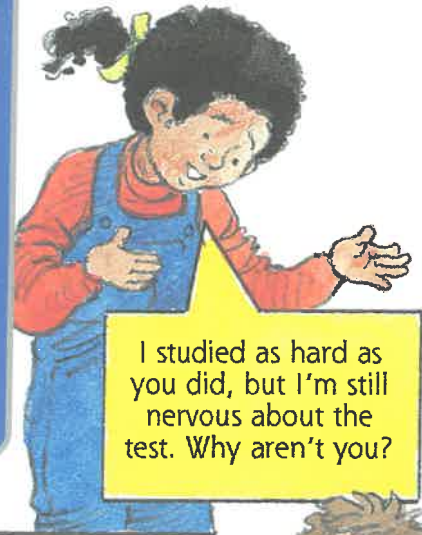
God does! You can find out how much He loves you by coming to Sunday school with me.

God listens, and He cares about your prayer. Maybe He sent rain because the plants and trees needed water. God takes care of all of His creation. That means you, too!

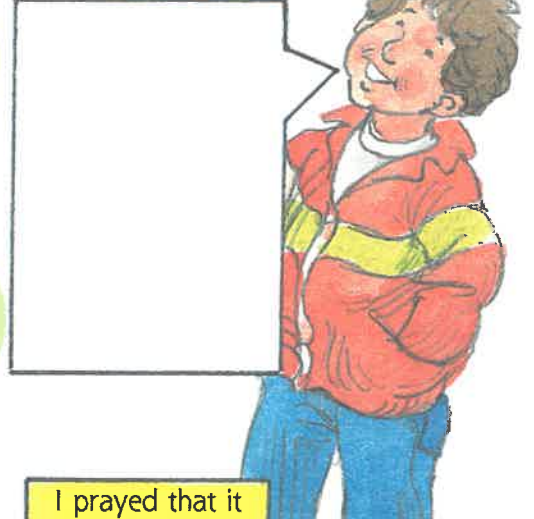
Why don't you pray about your problem? God cares about you, and He will give you the courage to tell your parents about what happened.
